- **Public Health - Seattle & King County: [Good Food Bags: increasing access to farm fresh produce](#)**. The [Good Food Bag](#) program is an effort that aims to increase the accessibility of fresh produce. The program, run by Tilth Alliance and Washington Community Action Network, delivers subsidized farm-fresh produce to families with limited financial resources in Seattle and South King County and has distribution sites that include preschools, churches and public health centers. Around 5,901 Good Food Bags were delivered in 2016 to 888 families.
